

The Peregrine Fund President

The Peregrine Fund seeks to recruit a dynamic leader to serve as President of an organization dedicated to the conservation of birds of prey worldwide, their habitats and supporting a deeper understanding of the relationship between birds of prey and our natural world.

About The Peregrine Fund:

The Peregrine Fund is a 501(c) (3) non-profit conservation organization dedicated to saving birds of prey from extinction. Throughout the world, birds of prey are threatened by shooting, poisoning, and loss of habitat. Saving these birds is an effective means of conserving the rich diversity of life that is critical to the future health of our planet and the well-being of generations to come. The Peregrine Fund's mission is to:

- Restore rare species of raptors through captive breeding and release.
- Improve the capacity for local raptor habitat conservation.
- Conduct scientific research and environmental education.

Founded in response to the catastrophic decline of Peregrine Falcons in the contiguous states, the Peregrine Fund pioneered captive propagation of peregrine falcons and released over 4,500 young falcons across their historic range. The result was that the birds reoccupied historic aeries and thrived. In 1999, the peregrine falcon was removed from the Endangered Species List –an accomplishment rarely achieved in history since the passage of the Endangered Species Act in 1972.

Between 1992 and 2000, the populations of three vulture species in southern Asia declined by 97-99% and no one knew why. The Peregrine Fund needed to act fast or they were going to lose these species. The Peregrine Fund's biologists solved the mystery. One of Peregrine Fund's hallmarks is a science-based, hands-on, solutions orientation to complex wildlife biology issues. The scientists at the Peregrine Fund identified a non-steroidal anti-inflammatory drug called diclofenac that was being used in veterinary medicine for livestock as being the cause of the puzzling vulture population crash. In 2004, The Peregrine Fund presented its discovery to south Asian governments and recommended banning its veterinary use and in 2006, India's government implemented a ban. Today, without diclofenac in the environment, vulture populations are beginning to stabilize.

In its 45 years, the Peregrine Fund has worked with more than 100 species in over 70 countries. They are the only conservation organization focused solely on conserving birds of prey worldwide. They are also the most successful raptor conservation organization keeping many species from becoming extinct. The Peregrine Fund has hatched and raised 20 species of raptors equaling more than 6,281 individuals. They are the first ever to successfully breed 6 of those species. The Peregrine Fund is often the "go-to" organization for captive breeding of endangered species and are valued for their expertise. More than 10 species have been systematically released to the wild to restore wild populations. The organization's scientists developed many of the techniques for successfully releasing captive-born raptors back to the wild. Without these efforts, many of these species would have become extinct.

Over the past several years, Peregrine Fund researchers have published approximately 1,450 scientific papers, books, theses, articles and reports to enhance the understanding of raptors in the scientific community. The Peregrine Fund scientists are some of the most respected in the raptor conservation community and other organizations look to the Peregrine Fund as a leader in how to study and conserve species. The Peregrine Fund is also looking into the future stewards of raptor and wildlife conservation. They are involved in conservation education and sustainable community building initiatives in each international location where the Peregrine Fund works. This includes teaching more profitable and sustainable livelihoods to communities as well as training, mentoring and supporting over 100 students around the world to increase local capacity for conservation science.

- Proven record of success guiding a business or nonprofit enterprise and a deep familiarity with the budgeting processes.
- Bachelor's degree required with an advanced degree or equivalent experience strongly preferred.
- Strong work ethic and willingness to travel extensively, often for weekend and evening engagements.

Personal Attributes:

- Passionate commitment to the values and mission of The Peregrine Fund and a demonstrated conservation ethic.
- Personal creativity and strategic vision, coupled with an ability to listen to others and learn from their best ideas a sense of inquisitiveness and intellectual curiosity.
- Ability to inspire trust, lead and facilitate with strong interpersonal skills and move from ideas to action.
- A superb professional and personal presence.
- Ability to think strategically, tactically and creatively.
- Visionary, articulate, and diplomatic.
